Following a record-breaking year for Trenton Children's Chorus (TCC) and leaving a wealth of incredible experiences, performances, and educational transformations in her wake, Ms. Patty Thel officially retired as Artistic Director in May.

During her tenure, TCC performed at: the United Nations, 9-11 memorial, Whitehouse (twice!), Drumthwacket, Richardson Auditorium, the Trenton War Memorial, and in Boston, MA. Her students shared the stage with: Boheme Opera, Roxey Ballet, the Princeton Katzenjammers, Earl Simmons, and countless ensembles.

When asked to reflect on her time at TCC, Ms. Thel had the following comments to offer:

My favorite memory [at TCC] has to be spending time at the White House with the Obamas and the TCC Chorale. This memory has the

special hue and sound of Christmas along with the smiles of Obamas and the students, the playfulness of the President around young people, and the intimate connection we all felt.

I want [my students] to know that there is no one like them - that if they don't share their voice with the world it will never be heard. I want them to know that they are loved, valued and have a future. I want them to know that hard work and discipline pay off, but the heart has to lead.

I hope the new artistic director will take the lead from their own vision and love of the community we serve. I hope the new artistic director will listen to the TCC family and understand the legacy of TCC while forging a new path forward.

The board, staff, families, students, and friends of Trenton Children's Chorus all wish Ms. Thel the best in this new chapter of her life.

FRESH NEW VISION FOR TCC

The following words are from TCC's new Artistic Director, Vinroy D. Brown, Jr.

This appointment holds a special meaning for me. I've been connected to the TCC family since my undergraduate years at Westminster Choir College; being able to serve this great organization in this way is nothing but a dream realized. I look forward to the possibilities for this next chapter in the life of TCC and my own.

I would like for TCC to begin a Composer in Residence program. It would bring a composer to TCC to work through the creation of a choral work- from text to music- throughout the entire year. For this inaugural year, I'd like to engage Professor Damien L. Sneed. He is a member of the faculty at Manhattan School of Music and is versed in classical, jazz, gospel and other genres of music. His Godmother and mentor was the late Jessye Norman. Kate Mulligan, Executive Director, and I have begun the conversation with Professor Sneed and he has graciously accepted the invitation.

One of my hopes for my role as Artistic Director was to develop an Artistic Advisory Board. This non-voting party would be comprised of colleagues and mentors of mine from around the country. This group would serve as a 'think tank' for larger TCC ideas and offer them an opportunity to affiliate with us through their own organizations. I am grateful to Co-Presidents Jill Jackson Carr and Nora Schultz for offering their support in this endeavor. TCC ALUMNI: “GET OUT THE VOTE!”

At the end of May, the country watched in shock as footage from the events surrounding the death of George Floyd were shared across news platforms. In the weeks that followed, voices rose across local, state, and national platforms against the persistent injustice toward Black Americans. The alumni of Trenton Children's Chorus added their voices to the outcry, and several former choristers have now dedicated themselves to becoming agents of change by actively advocating for supporters of the Back Lives Matter movement to "get out the vote."

The excerpt below is taken from a press release from Princeton Online, published July 22, 2020.

TRENTON, N.J. – Several months ago, Trenton Children's Chorus and the community and board which supports it, made a forceful statement on their website in response to the Black Lives Matter movement (see insert on adjacent page).

And the alumni of TCC went a step further. TCC former students decided to respond together in a way that would continue their commitment to change. Patty Thel, the former artistic director and advisor to the group, put it this way "Trenton Children's Chorus alums are scattered over the country, each alum contributing to their community, states and the country in ways that we are amazed to witness. This particular group of young women is awesome. Their faith and their passion for helping others is obvious. What a privilege it is to know them!"

Zoom meetings with the alums resulted in a commitment to get out the vote and work for voter registration. Two prominent African American women who have worked in the political field joined in to give their best advice. Katina Washington, who is based in North Carolina, worked on the Obama campaign and won the prize nationally for the most voter registrations in 2012. Raissa Walker is the chair of the Democratic committee in Trenton. Both were consultants on the zoom calls. The collective agreement was to encourage peers to engage in the political process.

All of the alums on the call were college graduates. Mrs. Thel adds, "and needless to say, they are all fabulous singers!"

Two of them, Melissa Simmons and Taylor Pickett-Stokes are each involved in public service. Melissa is a recent graduate of the New School in Florida and will be a first year teacher in high school chemistry in Florida in the fall. Taylor graduated from Montclair State University with a bachelors in Theatre Studies and Sociology and is currently in pursuit of a Dual Masters Degree

in Public Policy at Rutgers University. Taylor has been working at the Rescue Mission in Trenton.

Although the zoom calls have ended, the alums are independently moving out to do voter registration and encourage their friends to vote through social media and personal contact. Taylor and Melissa are actively encouraging peers and colleagues throughout her communities to vote. Taylor has even encouraged this topic of discussion throughout the Homeless Shelter (Rescue Mission of Trenton) so that the homeless population is not deprived of voting. Melissa will be looking into voter registration in Florida in nursing homes.

Melissa and Taylor shared how the impact of the movement and the meetings had influenced their perspectives:

Who inspires you in this current season of political and social change? In particular, who inspires you in the BLM movement?

Taylor: The people that inspire me during this BLM movement are my mother, my friends and my community as a whole. I've sat back and observed the response to this movement from "my people"- my community- and I must say I am very proud. Everything hasn't been done perfectly. It's true that some individuals have responded solely out of their emotions and that led to some questionable decisions. But ultimately, I feel the strength of my community more now than ever. It really feels like we are finally coming together. Now is the time to move! Now is the time to act! And we have to be strategic. And above all we have to let GOD be our leader.



Dear TCC family. Can we be vulnerable for a moment? Despite our legacy of service, we realize it's time to restate and reaffirm our collective values.

We acknowledge that Black Lives Matter.

Like you, we've watched the events of the last few weeks unfold. We recognize the collective cry of pain of injustice and continue to grieve in solidarity with our Black friends and family. **Breonna Taylor, Ahmaud Aubery** and most recently **George Floyd** join a long list of others whose lives have been taken as a result of police brutality and systemic racism.

Trenton Children's Chorus was founded as a social justice organization anchored by the belief that every child's voice has a place in the world, and we serve Trenton's youth so that they are heard. By amplifying their voices we are helping create courageous changemakers and confident leaders of a better world - who can dismantle the legacy of racism and embrace our shared humanity.

To further our work of empowering the lives of children, we commit to listening, responding, and advocating for the community we serve. That's our mission. That's what we've done for 30 years. We hope you will continue to join us.

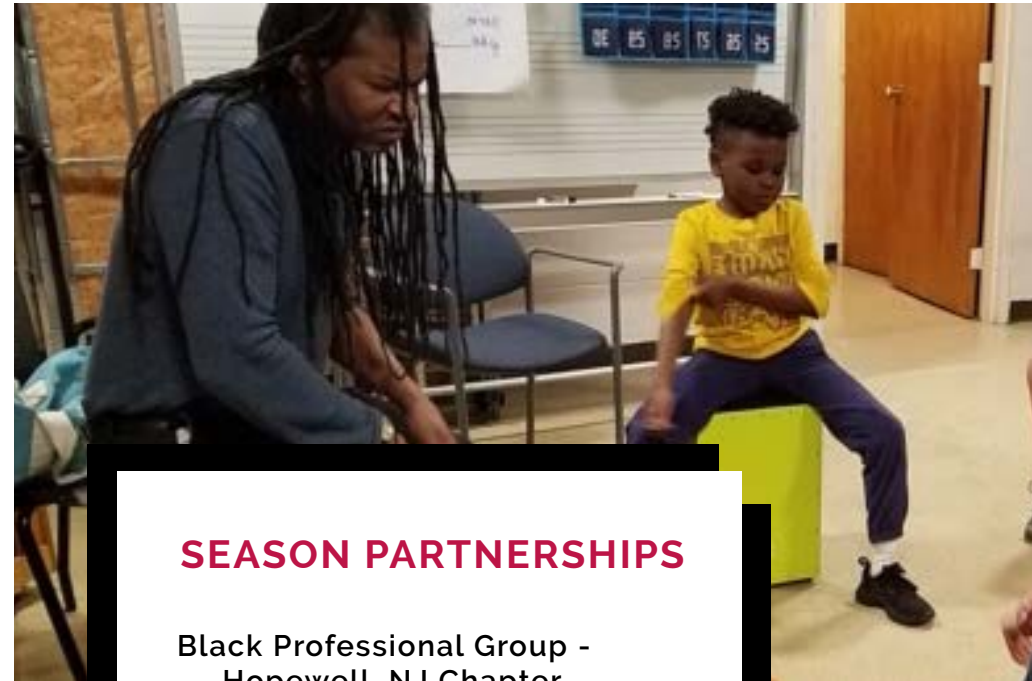
